

Jubilee Year Reflection:

Pope Francis highlights St. Mary Magdalen

Pope Francis highlighted Mary Magdalene's transformative encounter with the risen Christ as a model for personal conversion during a jubilee year audience at the Vatican's Paul VI Hall last Saturday.

"The jubilee is for people and for the Earth a new beginning; everything must be rethought within the dream of God," the pope told pilgrims gathered for the morning audience Feb. 1.

Drawing from the Gospel of John's account of Mary Magdalene at the empty tomb, Francis emphasized how she "turned around" multiple times before recognizing the risen Jesus — a detail the pontiff said was carefully chosen by the evangelist.

"The Risen One is not on the side of death but on the side of life," the Holy Father explained. "He can be mistaken for one of the people we encounter every day."

The pope connected Mary Magdalene's spiritual journey to the broader meaning of conversion, noting that entering "the new world" often requires changing perspective more than once.

Francis emphasized how Mary Magdalene recognized Jesus only when he spoke her name, suggesting that personal encounter is essential for authentic conversion.

"From Mary Magdalene, whom tradition calls 'the apostle of the apostles,' we learn hope," the pope said, adding that the journey of faith requires a "constant invitation to change perspective."

Francis warned that an overconfident and proud ego prevents recognition of the risen Jesus.

The pope concluded his catechesis with a challenging question for the faithful: "Do I know how to turn around to see things differently? Do I have the desire for conversion?"

5th Sunday of Ordinary Time

"In today's Gospel, Jesus teaches from Simon's boat. Jesus turns to Simon and instructs him about where to lower the fishing nets. Simon and others have been fishing throughout the night and have not caught anything. Simon ultimately obeys Jesus and lowers his nets into the deeper water as directed. Notice here that Peter calls Jesus by the title "master." He already recognizes Jesus as a person of authority. They catch so many fish that the nets begin to tear; Jesus' presence has created abundance out of scarcity, just as it did at the wedding feast at Cana, which we heard at Mass just a few weeks ago.

Simon Peter becomes a follower of Jesus immediately. He calls Jesus "Lord"—the title given to Jesus after his Resurrection—and protests his worthiness to be in Jesus' presence. Today's Gospel, therefore, marks a turning point in the relationship between Jesus and Peter.

Jesus gives Simon a new job, telling him that he will become a different kind of fisherman. No longer will he catch fish; instead he will catch people. In these words, we hear the beginning of the leadership role that Peter will have within the community of disciples.

We continue to speak of Peter's leadership and influence in the Church today when we call the pope the "successor of Peter." We participate in the mission of the Church when we bring people to Christ through the example and positive influence of our lives.

Reflexión sobre el Año Jubilar:

El Papa Francisco destaca a Santa María Magdalena

El Papa Francisco destacó el encuentro transformador de María Magdalena con Cristo resucitado como modelo para la conversión personal durante una audiencia del año jubilar en el Aula Pablo VI del Vaticano el sábado pasado.

"El jubileo es para los hombres y para la Tierra un nuevo comienzo; todo debe ser repensado dentro del sueño de Dios", dijo el papa a los peregrinos reunidos para la audiencia matutina del 1 de febrero.

Basándose en el relato del Evangelio de Juan de María Magdalena en la tumba vacía, Francisco enfatizó cómo ella "se dio la vuelta" varias veces antes de reconocer a Jesús resucitado, un detalle que el pontífice dijo que fue cuidadosamente elegido por el evangelista.

"El Resucitado no está del lado de la muerte, sino del lado de la vida", explicó el Santo Padre. "Puede ser confundido con una de las personas con las que nos encontramos todos los días".

El Papa conectó el viaje espiritual de María Magdalena con el significado más amplio de la conversión, señalando que entrar en "el nuevo mundo" a menudo requiere cambiar de perspectiva más de una vez.

Francisco enfatizó cómo María Magdalena reconoció a Jesús solo cuando pronunció su nombre, sugiriendo que el encuentro personal es esencial para una conversión auténtica.

"De María Magdalena, a quien la tradición llama 'la apóstol de los apóstoles', aprendemos la esperanza", dijo el papa, y agregó que el camino de la fe requiere una "invitación constante a cambiar de perspectiva".

Francisco advirtió que un ego demasiado confiado y orgulloso impide el reconocimiento de Jesús resucitado.

El Papa concluyó su catequesis con una pregunta desafiante para los fieles: "¿Sé dar la vuelta para ver las cosas de otra manera? ¿Tengo el deseo de la conversión?"

5º Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario

"En el Evangelio de hoy, Jesús enseña desde la barca de Simón. Jesús se dirige a Simón y le indica dónde bajar las redes de pesca. Simon y otros han estado pescando toda la noche y no han pescado nada. Simón finalmente obedece a Jesús y baja sus redes a las aguas más profundas como se le indicó. Nótese aquí que Pedro llama a Jesús por el título de "maestro". Ya reconoce a Jesús como una persona de autoridad. Atrapan tantos peces que las redes comienzan a rasgarse; La presencia de Jesús ha creado abundancia a partir de la escasez, tal como lo hizo en las bodas de Caná, que escuchamos en la Misa hace solo unas semanas.

Simón Pedro se convierte en un seguidor de Jesús inmediatamente. Llama a Jesús "Señor" —el título que se le dio a Jesús después de su resurrección— y protesta su dignidad de estar en la presencia de Jesús. El Evangelio de hoy, por tanto, marca un punto de inflexión en la relación entre Jesús y Pedro.

Jesús le da a Simón un nuevo trabajo, diciéndole que se convertirá en un tipo diferente de pescador. Ya no pescará; en cambio, atrapará a la gente. En estas palabras, escuchamos el comienzo del papel de liderazgo que Pedro tendrá dentro de la comunidad de discípulos.

Seguimos hablando del liderazgo y la influencia de Pedro en la Iglesia hoy cuando llamamos al Papa el "sucesor de Pedro". Participamos en la misión de la Iglesia cuando llevamos a las personas a Cristo a través del ejemplo y la influencia positiva de nuestras vidas.



Lift Up Your Hearts

There may come some time in our lives when we feel like Simon Peter: "Master, we have worked hard and have caught nothing." I have nothing to show for all my work....BUT...I WILL DO WHATEVER YOU SAY, I will lower my nets..." (Lk: 5;1-11). Go ahead, think about Peter, we are all like him once in a while. WE can get down on ourselves....why bother "fishing", I get nothing anyway. Oh yes....we have our Life patterns.

This kind of thinking or talk can lead to other false "solutions"....as it has happened to people in the AA program or the NA group. Yes, anybody can get "addicted" to negativity. People will even reject themselves or even help from Jesus. Even our St. Peter said....let me go Lord....for I am a no-good sinner.

But we can easily forget that Jesus is also with us in our own "boat of Life." We must never fall into that pattern of thinking that tempts us into saying: I am no good.... depart from me Lord, I am beyond doing any good.

Jesus will remind us very clearly as He did Peter:

"DO NOT BE AFRAID, I have a job for you.

Yes, we must turn to the Lord Jesus and in our daily prayer ask for His love and guidance. We must learn to live one day at a time, and at the end of each day, count our blessings and remember that Jesus is the Lord of our Lives.






