
6th Sunday in Ordinary Time

"Last Sunday we heard Jesus call Peter to be his disciple. Jesus then travels with Peter and the other disciples. Luke reports acts of healing (a person with leprosy and a paralytic man) and the call of Levi, the tax collector. Jesus also replies to questions from the Pharisees regarding fasting and the observance of the Sabbath. In the verses immediately before today's gospel reading, Jesus is reported to have chosen 12 men from among his disciples to be apostles. Apostle is a Greek word that means "one who is sent."

Today's gospel reading is the beginning of what is often called the Sermon on the Plain. We find a parallel to this passage in Matthew 5:1-7,11 that is often called the Sermon on the Mount. As these titles suggest, there are differences and similarities between these gospel readings.

When spoken from the mountaintop in Matthew's Gospel, we can't miss the impression that Jesus is speaking with the authority and voice of God. The mountaintop is a symbol of closeness to God. Those who ascend the mountain see God and speak for God; recall the story of Moses and the Ten Commandments. As Luke introduces the location of Jesus' teaching, Jesus teaches on level ground, alongside the disciples and the crowd. Luke presents Jesus' authority in a different light. He is God among us.

Another distinction found in Luke's version is the audience. Luke's Sermon on the Plain is addressed to Jesus' disciples, although in the presence of the crowd; Matthew's Sermon on the Mount is addressed to the crowd. In keeping with this style, the Beatitudes in Luke's Gospel sound more personal than those in Matthew's Gospel—Luke uses the article "you" whereas Matthew uses "they" or "those." There is also a difference in number: Matthew describes eight beatitudes; Luke presents just four, each of which has a parallel warning.

The form of the Beatitudes found in Luke's and Matthew's Gospel is not unique to Jesus. Beatitudes are found in the Old Testament, such as in the Psalms and in Wisdom literature. They are a way to teach about who will find favor with God. The word blessed in this context might be translated as "happy," "fortunate," or "favored."

As we listen to this Gospel, the Beatitudes jar our sensibilities. Those who are poor, hungry, weeping, or persecuted are called blessed. This is, indeed, a Gospel of reversals. Those often thought to have been forgotten by God are called blessed. In the list of "woes," those whom we might ordinarily describe as blessed by God are warned about their peril. Riches, possessions, laughter, reputation . . . these are not things that we can depend upon as sources of eternal happiness. They not only fail to deliver on their promise; our misplaced trust in them will lead to our demise. The ultimate peril is in misidentifying the source of our eternal happiness.

The Beatitudes are often described as a framework for Christian living. Our vocation as Christians is not to be first in this world, but rather to be first in the eyes of God. We are challenged to examine our present situation in the context of our ultimate horizon, the Kingdom of God." (loyolapress.com)

Fin de Semana en Birney's

Nombran nuevo arzobispo para Detroit

El Papa Francisco ha nombrado al Obispo Edward J. Weisenburger, actualmente Obispo de la Diócesis de Tucson, como el sexto arzobispo de Detroit. El arzobispo electo sucede al arzobispo Allen H. Vigneron, quien ha servido a la arquidiócesis desde 2009. Será instalado el 19 de marzo, solemnidad de San José. Por favor, oren por él ya que pronto comenzará su ministerio como nuestro Pastor, y por favor oren por los 18 años de servicio del arzobispo Vigneron.

6º Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario

"El domingo pasado escuchamos a Jesús llamar a Pedro para que fuera su discípulo. Entonces Jesús viaja con Pedro y los demás discípulos. Lucas relata actos de curación (una persona con lepra y un paralítico) y la llamada de Leví, el recaudador de impuestos. Jesús también responde a las preguntas de los fariseos sobre el ayuno y la observancia del sábado. En los versículos inmediatamente antes de la lectura del evangelio de hoy, se informa que Jesús eligió a 12 hombres de entre sus discípulos para ser apóstoles. Apóstol es una palabra griega que significa "el que es enviado".

La lectura del evangelio de hoy es el comienzo de lo que a menudo se llama el Sermón de la Llanura. Encontramos un paralelo a este pasaje en Mateo 5:1-7,11 que a menudo se llama el Sermón del Monte. Como sugieren estos títulos, hay diferencias y similitudes entre estas lecturas del evangelio.

Cuando se habla desde la cima de la montaña en el Evangelio de Mateo, no podemos perder la impresión de que Jesús está hablando con la autoridad y la voz de Dios. La cima de la montaña es un símbolo de cercanía a Dios. Los que suben a la montaña ven a Dios y hablan en nombre de Dios; recordemos la historia de Moisés y los Diez Mandamientos. A medida que Lucas presenta el lugar de la enseñanza de Jesús, Jesús enseña en un terreno llano, junto a los discípulos y la multitud. Lucas presenta la autoridad de Jesús bajo una luz diferente. Él es Dios entre nosotros.

Otra distinción que se encuentra en la versión de Lucas es la audiencia. El Sermón de la llanura de Lucas está dirigido a los discípulos de Jesús, aunque en presencia de la multitud; El Sermón de la Montaña de Mateo está dirigido a la multitud. De acuerdo con este estilo, las Bienaventuranzas en el Evangelio de Lucas suenan más personales que las del Evangelio de Mateo: Lucas usa el artículo "tú" mientras que Mateo usa "ellos" o "aquellos". También hay una diferencia en el número: Mateo describe ocho bienaventuranzas; Lucas presenta solo cuatro, cada uno de los cuales tiene una advertencia paralela.

La forma de las Bienaventuranzas que se encuentran en los Evangelios de Lucas y Mateo no es exclusiva de Jesús. Las bienaventuranzas se encuentran en el Antiguo Testamento, como en los Salmos y en la literatura sapiencial. Son una manera de enseñar acerca de quién hallará el favor de Dios. La palabra bienaventurado en este contexto podría traducirse como "feliz", "afortunado" o "favorecido".

Al escuchar este Evangelio, las Bienaventuranzas sacuden nuestra sensibilidad. A los pobres, hambrientos, llorosos o perseguidos se les llama bienaventurados. Este es, de hecho, un Evangelio de reveses. Aquellos que a menudo se piensa que han sido olvidados por Dios son llamados bienaventurados. En la lista de los "ayes", aquellos a quienes ordinariamente podríamos describir como bendecidos por Dios son advertidos acerca de su peligro. Riquezas, posesiones, risas, reputación . . . Estas no son cosas en las que podamos confiar como fuentes de felicidad eterna. No solo no cumplen su promesa; Nuestra confianza equivocada en ellos nos llevará a nuestra desaparición. El mayor peligro está en identificar erróneamente la fuente de nuestra felicidad eterna.

Las Bienaventuranzas a menudo se describen como un marco para la vida cristiana. Nuestra vocación como cristianos no es ser los primeros en este mundo, sino ser los primeros a los ojos de Dios. Se nos desafía a examinar nuestra situación actual en el contexto de nuestro horizonte último, el Reino de Dios". (loyolapress.com)



Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Treasures from our Tradition

Valentine's Day approaches, and its immediate impact may be heard in the rectory, as the newly engaged come forward to "set a date." We owe this scenario to reforms made by the emperor Charlemagne late in the eighth century.

He required that nobles and commoners alike have public weddings, and also required that marrying couples be examined for factors that would block a marriage, such as previous marriages or close kinship. The pope was more conservative, however, and resisted the emperor's creativity. It was enough for the pope that the couples exchange consent.

That tradition is passed on to this day, to some couples' surprise. In 866, Pope Nicholas ruled that a marriage was legal and binding even without a liturgy or public celebration. After that, it was the consent of the couple, not the blessing of parents or priest, that made a marriage "count." If consent was lacking, such as through abduction or fear, then the marriage could not "take." Charlemagne got a great deal done, but he was a political flash in the pan, and the empire had virtually collapsed by the year 1000.

Europe broke into a checkerboard of princedoms and languages, and at last all marriages came under the church, the glue holding the known world together.






