## Quo Vadis Domine Shepherd's Report Pastoral Letter

I appreciate your patience with the pause regarding the anticipated Pastoral Letter that was originally scheduled to be sent in January. The letter was placed in the mail this

past Friday, so I expect you will be receiving it, if not already, in the next few days.

As you await the opportunity to read the letter, and the changes within it, I am very aware of how unsettling this can be. Change is often difficult and can create an atmosphere of doubt or uncertainty. While this is an acknowledged reality, it does not pose a valid reason for ignoring what is known to even the causal observer....changes are necessary to be prepared for the future so we can stay focused on the mission of the Church.

Within the Shepherd's Report: Pastoral Letter sent home to every registered parishioner; I outline three main areas that will be affected by the changes:

- Weekday and Weekend Mass schedule
- Parish Office hours
- Pastoral Staff positions

For further reference about the data that went into the discernment for these changes, the power point presentation (Shepherd's Report) that was delivered 22 times amongst our 6 parishes, has been available on the first page of the St. Frances Cabrini website since October (cabriniparish.org). If you have not yet viewed it, I encourage you to do so. Also, as was announced by the Archbishop two weeks ago, the entire Archdiocese of Detroit will be lead through a reorganization process with a newly created office called the Office of Parish Renewal. A letter from the Archbishop was published outlining the vision and scope of this effort. You can find that letter at aod.org or at the Families of Parishes button on the parish websites under Pastoral Notes. No Second Tunic is the title of the Pastoral Note.

Please continue to pray for a spirit of docility and charity. Through the embrace of these virtues, we'll find the wisdom and understanding from the Holy Spirit to take these new steps together as a Family of Parishes.

## CSA needs your help!

As you can see from the bulletin, not all our parishes have been able to attain the assigned CSA goal. I ask that you prayerfully consider helping your parish by donating at: [givesca.org](http://givesca.org). If we fail to realize the goal, it will come out of our parish budget, a budget that has no 'wiggle room'.....which is the case for each parish.

May is the month when the CSA begins. It is my prayer that we can reach our goals this month, to avoid cutting a program from our budget and allow our parishioners some distance between the old (2024) and new (2025) CSA campaign.

Thank you to those who have already given, and I pray those who have not will do so this week. God bless your generosity.

## Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time

"Today's gospel reading is a continuation of the teaching that began in last Sunday's gospel. We continue to hear Jesus' Sermon on the Plain.

These words from Jesus' teaching are familiar to us. They constitute the crux and the challenge of what it means to be a disciple: Love your enemies, turn the other cheek, give to those who ask, do unto others, lend without expecting repayment, judge not lest you be judged.

There are several similarities between Luke's and Matthew's report of Jesus' great teaching. Both begin with the Beatitudes. There are, however, differences in language and nuance. For example, Matthew presents this portion of the teaching as a contrast between Jesus' teaching and the teachings of the law and the prophets. This is in keeping with Matthew's concern to address his predominantly Jewish audience. It is likely that Luke omits this contrast because it was unnecessary for the Gentile believers for whom Luke is writing.

In both Gospels, Jesus' words challenge those who would follow him to be more like God. God loves us beyond our expectations, beyond anything we can possibly imagine. In response to God's love, we are to love as God loves, beyond expectations and with a depth beyond imagining." (loyolapress.com)

## Quo Vadis Domine Informe del Pastor Carta Pastoral

Agradezco su paciencia con la pausa con respecto a la anticipada Carta Pastoral que originalmente estaba programada para ser enviada en enero. La carta fue enviada por correo el viernes pasado, por lo que espero que la reciban, si no lo han hecho ya, en los próximos días.

Mientras esperan la oportunidad de leer la carta, y los cambios en ella, soy muy consciente de lo inquietante que puede ser. El cambio suele ser difícil y puede crear una atmósfera de duda o incertidumbre. Si bien esta es una realidad reconocida, no representa una razón válida para ignorar lo que se sabe, incluso para el observador causal... los cambios son necesarios para estar preparados para el futuro y así poder mantenernos enfocados en la misión de la Iglesia.

Dentro del Informe del Pastor: Carta Pastoral enviada a casa a cada feligrés registrado; Describo tres áreas principales que se verán afectadas por los cambios:

- Horario de misas entre semana y fin de semana
- Horario de Oficina Parroquial
- Cargos del personal pastoral

Para obtener más información sobre los datos que se utilizaron en el discernimiento para estos cambios, la presentación en power point (Informe del Pastor) que se entregó 22 veces entre nuestras 6 parroquias, ha estado disponible en la primera página del sitio web de St. Frances Cabrini desde octubre ([cabriniparish.org](http://cabriniparish.org)). Si aún no lo has visto, te animo a que lo hagas. Además, como fue anunciado por el arzobispo hace dos semanas, toda la Arquidiócesis de Detroit será conducida a través de un proceso de reorganización con una oficina recién creada llamada Oficina de Renovación Parroquial. Se publicó una carta del arzobispo en la que se esbozaba la visión y el alcance de este esfuerzo. Puede encontrar esa carta en [aod.org](http://aod.org) o en el botón de Familias de Parroquias en los sitios web de las parroquias en Notas Pastorales. Ninguna segunda túnica es el título de la Nota Pastoral.

Por favor, continúen rezando por un espíritu de docilidad y caridad. A través de la adopción de estas virtudes, encontraremos la sabiduría y el entendimiento del Espíritu Santo para dar estos nuevos pasos juntos como Familia de Parroquias.

## Séptimo Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario

"La lectura del Evangelio de hoy es una continuación de la enseñanza que comenzó en el Evangelio del domingo pasado. Seguimos escuchando el Sermón de Jesús en la llanura.

Estas palabras de la enseñanza de Jesús nos son familiares. Constituyen el quid y el desafío de lo que significa ser un discípulo: Amad a vuestros enemigos, poned la otra mejilla, dad a los que piden, haced a los demás, prestad sin esperar recompensa, no juzguéis para que no seáis juzgados.

Hay varias similitudes entre el informe de Lucas y el de Mateo sobre la gran enseñanza de Jesús. Ambos comienzan con las Bienaventuranzas. Sin embargo, hay diferencias en el lenguaje y los matices. Por ejemplo, Mateo presenta esta porción de la enseñanza como un contraste entre la enseñanza de Jesús y las enseñanzas de la ley y los profetas. Esto está en consonancia con la preocupación de Mateo de dirigirse a su audiencia predominantemente judía. Es probable que Lucas omita este contraste porque era innecesario para los creyentes gentiles para quienes Lucas está escribiendo.

En ambos Evangelios, las palabras de Jesús desafían a aquellos que lo seguirían a ser más como Dios. Dios nos ama más allá de nuestras expectativas, más allá de cualquier cosa que podamos imaginar. En respuesta al amor de Dios, debemos amar como Dios ama, más allá de las expectativas y con una profundidad más allá de lo imaginable". ([loyolapress.com](http://loyolapress.com))

## Saint Gregory

**Feast Day February 27**

It can be so comforting to those who have experienced certain hardship in life to be able to identify with a particular saint. For example, today's saint, Gregory of Narek, was an orphan. He was born in Turkey in the middle of the 10th century. After his parents died, he went to live with his uncle, who was a monk. Gregory entered the monastery and later became a priest and a theology professor.

He was also a mystic and became a well-known writer and poet. One of his pieces, which he described as "an encyclopedia of prayer for all nations," has been translated into thirty languages. He spent his life within the walls of the Narek monastery and was buried there in the early 11th century. Pope Francis declared Gregory, already a saint of the Armenian Apostolic Church, a Doctor of the Church in 2015. He is the patron saint of musicians, singers, students and teachers. Saint Gregory of Narek, pray for us!

# Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time

## Stagnant or Overflowing?

We find ourselves in the midst of a short, seven and a half week stint of Ordinary Time. It can seem like we are somewhat lost in time - no longer in the Christmas season and not yet in the throes of Lent. It can also be a dreary time. All of the exterior lights are extinguished; the days are still short and the nights still long. The gray clouds and threats of snow linger on in some parts, yet without the childlike anticipation to pull us through.

What do we have to look forward to now? How can we not grow stagnant in our walk of faith during this time?

A friend once told me that Ordinary Time was his favorite season of all. When he first said it, I thought he was crazy. How can anyone enjoy Ordinary Time more than Christmas or Easter?! But then he shared that, just as the liturgical color green indicates, Ordinary Time is a season of growth. As we muddle through the mundane, tackle the trivial and battle the boredom, we are invited to continue blossoming and blooming.

In today's first reading we discover Saul and David in the middle of a cat and mouse chase. Saul finds himself in a jealous rage and wishes to extinguish David, while David's men encourage him to obliterate Saul. David could have just as easily become enraged. After all, his best friend's father wanted to chop his head off! But he fled in self defense, and when afforded the opportunity to retaliate, refused to lay a finger on the Lord's anointed one. He acquiesced to God rather than anger.

Jesus puts the actions of David into words saying: "love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you, pray for those who mistreat you... Do to others as you would have them do to you...and you will be children of the Most High, for he himself is kind to the ungrateful and the wicked." Sounds selfless and saintly and... super hard. To act in a way that gains no reward, not even a tiny bit of dopamine, sounds just horrible. It offers my humanness no motivation, my pride no boost.

Yet we live for the promise of a different kind of reward all together: "then your reward will be great and you will be children of the Most High...gifts will be given to you; a good measure, packed together, shaken down and overflowing..." So let us shake off the ordinaryness of this time and dive into the growth, so that our heavenly reward may be overflowing.

## **Giving Back Your Gifts**

Christians are called to be “faithful stewards” of our God-given gifts. Using your talents (or Charisms) for God can help you find purposeful work and share God’s love. Depending on what your gifts are, you will most likely be using those talents in different ways.

There are many examples of ways talents can be used to show glory to God. If you are gifted in teaching, perhaps you can use your talents to help teach a Sunday school class at your church. If you are an artist, you might use your talent to create art that depicts events or that people can relate to. Do you find it easy to converse with others? Consider using that gift to ask someone who is lonely to lunch. Is cooking one of your talents? Preparing meals for a person who lost a family member could be one application of your talent.

Look for opportunities to serve God, although using your talents for God might not look the same every day. Even if you do not see how your talent is making an impact, it is important to let yourself be used by God because you may never know how you affected someone’s life.

Preparar comidas para una persona que perdió a un miembro de su familia podría ser una aplicación de su talento.

Busca oportunidades para servir a Dios, aunque usar tus talentos para Dios no sea igual todos los días. Incluso si no ves cómo tu talento está teniendo un impacto, es importante que te dejes usar por Dios porque es posible que nunca sepas cómo afectaste la vida de alguien.

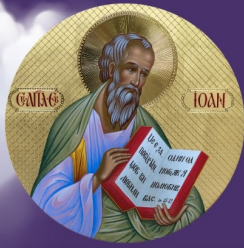

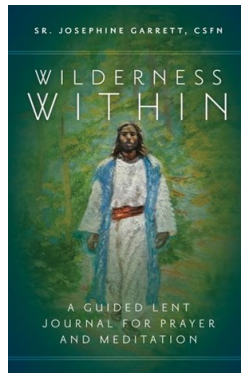
