Pentecost Sunday

"The season of Easter concludes with today's celebration, the feast of Pentecost. On Pentecost we celebrate the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles gathered in the upper room in Jerusalem; this event marks the beginning of the Church. The account in today's

Gospel, taken from the Gospel of John, also recounts how Jesus gave the gift of the Holy Spirit to his disciples. There is no need to try to reconcile these two accounts to each other. It is enough to know that, after his death, Jesus fulfilled his promise to send to his disciples a helper, an advocate, who would enable them to be his witnesses throughout the world.

In the context of the feast of Pentecost, this reading reminds us about the integral connection between the gifts of peace and forgiveness and the action of the Holy Spirit. Jesus greets his disciples with the gift of peace. Jesus then commissions his disciples to continue the work that he has begun, "As the Father has sent me, so I send you." As he breathes the Holy Spirit upon them, Jesus sends his disciples to continue his work of reconciliation through the forgiveness of sins.

This Gospel reminds us that the Church is called to be a reconciling presence in the world. This reconciling presence is also to be a way of life for Christians. In situations of conflict, we are to be agents of peace and harmony among people." (loyolapress.com)

Congratulations newly ordained priests!

Deacon Pat Bruen, 67, and Deacon Benjamin Schroder, 26, look forward to serving the Lord's people in southeast Michigan as the newest priest in the Archdiocese of Detroit.

On Saturday, June 7, Archbishop Edward J. Weisenburger will ordain transitional deacons Pat Bruen and Benjamin Schroder, who have spent several years preparing through seminary studies and field ministry. The two men will be ordained priests "now and forever," but the two took two completely different paths in their journey to becoming Christ's ministers on earth.

Deacon Pat Bruen, 67, is late-in-life priestly vocation, studying at Pope St. John XXIII National Seminary in Weston, Mass. He graduated from Sacred Heart High School in Dearborn and went on to Spring Arbor College to obtain a bachelor's in health care management and Central Michigan University to earn a master's in database management.

"I was married for 40 years, so I did not have a call when I was younger," Deacon Bruen told Detroit Catholic. "But my longtime friend and now pastor, Fr. Bob McCabe, suggested I pray about it. I thought I was too old, but the Lord had other plans."

Deacon Benjamin Schroder, 26, was working at a hardware store and took a few classes at Sacred Heart Major Seminary in Detroit before he first thought he might have a vocation to the priesthood. After graduating from Utica Community Schools' International Baccalaureate program, he wasn't exactly convinced he was destined for the priesthood.

"I attended a vocations night for altar servers that the seminary hosted, and I was pretty confident I wouldn't be a priest until after some seminarians shared their vocation story. The simple realization that God knows what will make me happy, and He also wants me to be happy, helped me a lot in discerning what the Lord was calling me to do."

Al infundir el Espíritu Santo sobre ellos, Jesús envía a sus discípulos a continuar su obra de reconciliación mediante el perdón de los pecados.

El diácono Pat Bruen, de 67 años, y el diácono Benjamin Schroder, de 26, esperan servir al pueblo del Señor en el sureste de Michigan como el sacerdote más nuevo de la Arquidiócesis de Detroit.

El sábado 7 de junio, el arzobispo Edward J. Weisenburger ordenará a los diáconos transitorios Pat Bruen y Benjamin Schroder, quienes han dedicado varios años a prepararse mediante estudios de seminario y ministerio en el campo. Ambos serán ordenados sacerdotes "ahora y para siempre", pero ambos tomaron caminos completamente diferentes en su camino hacia convertirse en ministros de Cristo en la tierra.

El diácono Pat Bruen, de 67 años, tiene vocación sacerdotal tardía y estudió en el Seminario Nacional Papa San Juan XXIII en Weston, Massachusetts. Se graduó de Sacred Heart High School en Dearborn y asistió a Spring Arbor College para obtener una licenciatura en administración de atención médica y en Central Michigan University para obtener una maestría en administración de bases de datos.

"Estuve casado durante 40 años, así que no tuve un llamado cuando era más joven", declaró el diácono Bruen a Detroit Catholic. "Pero mi viejo amigo y ahora párroco, el padre Bob McCabe, me sugirió que orara al respecto. Pensé que era demasiado viejo, pero el Señor tenía otros planes".

El diácono Benjamin Schroder, de 26 años, trabajaba en una ferretería y tomó algunas clases en el Seminario Mayor del Sagrado Corazón en Detroit antes de pensar que podría tener una vocación sacerdotal. Tras graduarse del programa de Bachillerato Internacional de las Escuelas Comunitarias de Utica, no estaba del todo convencido de estar destinado al sacerdocio.

Asistí a una noche de vocaciones para monaguillos que organizó el seminario, y estaba bastante seguro de que no sería sacerdote hasta que algunos seminaristas compartieron su historia vocacional. La simple comprensión de que Dios sabe qué me hará feliz, y que también quiere que lo sea, me ayudó mucho a discernir a qué me llamaba el Señor.

Dear Friends,

We continue to consider the theme of 'vocation' this June as we progress through this 2025 Jubilee Year as a family of parishes. Once again, please know that on June 20th we'll have a Holy Hour with songs and prayer at St. Mary Magdalen during which we will more deliberately consider this theme. This Sunday I'd like to go one layer deeper in my thoughts and reflections having to do with "vocation" and "vocations":

- The universal call to fullness of life
- The universal call to holiness
- Religious vocations
- Priestly vocations
- All other vocations in the Mystical Body

This phrase — the universal call to holiness — emerged as a catchphrase of sorts from the Second Vatican Council. It was hoped that this phrase would combat the idea that priests and monks and nuns were called to be holy but that it was different for the rest of us.

Another way of looking at this question would be this — who does the Holy Spirit touch in this world? All or just a few? The answer, of course, is all. The Holy Spirit wants to transform all and give them healing, restoration, and peace.

To be holy is to allow this transformation to happen within you. It happens to you and becomes possible when the first layer of vocation is taken care of. It's a process that takes place through Him, with Him, and In Him... Isn't this an interesting question to reflect on there at home — is holiness possible for the non-Christian?

Think of Jesus on the cross "Father, forgive them..." This is possible for him because He saw all possible outcomes... you and me embracing to the core the great saying of Leon Bloy — "The only real sadness, the only real failure, the only great tragedy in life, is not to become a saint."



He was born in present-day Turkey, the son of a pagan priest and a Christian mother. From a very young age, he displayed an explosive temper, which he learned to control. At a very young age, he was baptized and later ordained a deacon. His ministry was dedicated to teaching the faith, for he was a great teacher.

His bishop, noting his Christian and human qualities, wanted to ordain him a priest, but Ephrem opposed it, considering the priesthood unworthy of him. As a deacon and teacher, he spread Christian teaching with extraordinary writing skills, making use of poetry, religious songs, and parodying the lyrics of popular songs of his time to not only refute Christian heresies but also to propagate the teachings of Christ.

History distinguishes him with the nickname "The Zither of the Holy Spirit." Through his poetry, he founded a theological school.

Although he did not speak Greek, he was bold in his language, writing poems dedicated to Mary, Mother of God. His writings and mysticism made him one of the Doctors of the Church.

Domingo de Pentecostés

Enseñar y recorder

No soy muy bueno contando chistes. Me gustan, pero después de escuchar uno y reírme, lo dejo pasar y lo olvido. Me imagino que esto no sólo se aplica a los chistes. El Evangelio de hoy da a entender que los discípulos pueden haber tenido la misma debilidad cuando Jesús dice que el Espíritu "les enseñará todas las cosas y les recordará todo cuanto yo les he dicho" (Juan 14,26).

Jesús pasó tres años enseñando a sus discípulos acerca del Reino de Dios. Si bien puede haber condensado su mensaje a "Ama al Señor tu Dios... ama a tu prójimo como a ti mismo" (Marcos 12,30–31), pasó la mayor parte de su tiempo demostrándoles cuánto Dios los ama y cómo amar al prójimo. Utilizó parábolas como ejemplos y milagros como signos del amor del Padre. Respondió a sus preguntas y explicó las cosas en privado. Sabiendo que esto todavía no sería suficiente, prometió enviar al Espíritu después de haber resucitado. Parece que sabía que a veces no se puede aprender solo por escuchar. Hay que experimentar algunas cosas para entenderlas. A veces hay que explicarle algo a otra persona antes de entenderlo uno mismo. Y eso es lo que hacían los discípulos.

Cuando recibieron el Espíritu después de la resurrección de Jesús, comenzaron a hablar de Jesús a todos los que quisieran escucharlos. También comenzaron a hacer las cosas de las que Jesús hablaba. Alimentaron a los pobres y sanaron a los enfermos. Así comenzaron a experimentar a Jesús en quienes los rodeaban. Recordaban lo que Jesús les había enseñado y lo aplicaban a sus vidas. Incluso aceptaban el sufrimiento por la fe.

Nosotros también podemos recibir esa promesa de Jesús de que el Espíritu nos enseñe y nos recuerde. Mientras compartimos la fe con los demás, comenzamos a experimentar a Jesús en ellos. El hecho de hablar de la fe ayuda a que crezca.

Mientras escuchamos al Señor en la oración, recordamos pasajes de la Biblia que hemos leído o escuchado desde el altar el domingo. Comenzamos a entender cómo se aplican en nuestras vidas. Quizás recordemos cosas que parecían muy malas en el momento pero que resultaron ser parte del plan de Dios: tal vez perder un trabajo y luego encontrar uno mejor, o alejarnos de nuestros amigos por una mudanza y luego hacer nuevos amigos.

Que el Espíritu Santo nos enseñe y nos recuerde las señales del amor de Dios.

Lift Up Your Hearts

Pentecost Sunday

Teach and Remind

I'm not very good at telling jokes. I like them, but after I hear one and laugh at it, I let it go and forget it. I suspect this doesn't just apply to jokes. The Gospel today hints that the disciples may have had the same weakness when Jesus says the Spirit will "teach you everything and remind you of all that I told you" (John 14:26).

Jesus spent three years teaching his disciples about the kingdom of God. While he may have condensed his message to "Love God . . . and love your neighbor as yourself" (Mark 12:30–31), he spent most of his time showing them how much God loves them and how to love their neighbor. He used parables as examples and miracles as signs of the Father's love. He answered their questions and explained things privately. Knowing that this would still not be enough, he promised to send the Spirit after he had risen. He seems to have known that sometimes you just can't learn by listening. You have to experience some things to understand them. Sometimes you understand it yourself. And that is what the disciples would do.

When they received the Spirit after Jesus' resurrection, they began to talk about Jesus to anyone who would listen. They also began to do the things Jesus talked about. They fed the poor and healed the sick. Thus they began to experience Jesus in those around them. They would remember what Jesus had taught them and apply it in their lives. They even accepted suffering for their faith.

We too can receive that promise from Jesus to have the Spirit teach and remind us. As we share our faith with others, we begin to experience Jesus in them. Just talking about our faith helps it to grow. As we listen to the Lord in prayer, we are reminded of passages in the Bible that we have read or heard from the altar on Sunday. We begin to understand how they apply in our lives. We may remember things that seemed to be very bad but turned out to be God's plan maybe losing a job, only to find a better one; or moving away from friends, only to make new friends later.

May the Holy Spirit teach and remind us of the signs of God's love.
