My Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Happy Easter! Christ is risen! He is truly risen! Alleluia! Alleluia! We've passed through our forty days of prayer, fasting and almsgiving during Lent and have walked with Jesus through the lifechanging events of Holy Week. These

celebrations remind us of just how much Jesus loves us. It is time to celebrate with great joy Jesus' overcoming sin and death by rising from the dead. Jesus, who had done so much good and brought such great hope to people, had seemingly been a light tragically extinguished. Darkness had truly come to Jesus' disciples and to the world.

Despite all that Jesus had done to prepare them, they certainly weren't ready for his gruesome death. Shock and disbelief, sadness and pain gave way to the joy of knowing that Jesus had risen from the dead. Imagine what it would be like for us if one of our dearest loved ones had died and then we learned three days later that they had come back to life. It's difficult to imagine the depth of joy we would feel over our loved one rising from the dead. Jesus' opposition had tried to get rid of him. They thought they had accomplished their mission, but it didn't work so well for them. They clearly didn't know who they were dealing with – the Son of God and the Savior of the World.

Joy is what Easter is all about. We have our crosses, our trials, our frustrations, our difficulties in life. We need the joy of knowing that God has something wonderful in store for us beyond even the greatest things we could ever imagine in our lives in this world. Evil, sin, the devil and death have been overcome by Jesus once and for all through his resurrection from the dead. The way has been opened for us to be with God forever in heaven. Death will come and take us, but it cannot hold us because of Jesus' cross and resurrection. We have cause for great joy. Alleluia!!! We have the opportunity to celebrate this Easter joy for an "octave," eight days and then throughout the rest of the Easter season which lasts fifty days until our celebration of the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost.

A special part of Easter each year is the initiation of our brothers and sisters into our Catholic faith through the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and Communion at our Easter Vigil Mass. These men, women, teenagers and children prepared extensively to commit themselves to God through our Catholic faith. We welcome them to our parishes in the Quo Vadis Family of Parishes. I congratulate each of them and their families and thank them for their witness to our faith.

They are powerful reminders for us of both the beauty, the goodness and the challenge of our Catholic faith

and of all that we're each called to be and to do. May God bless each of them as they continue to move forward in their journey of faith!

What can we do to celebrate fifty days of the Easter season and keep our sense of Easter joy going through the entire season? That's a good question. It takes effort! When I was serving at the seminary, one of the seminarians committed himself to eating ice cream each of the fifty days. That's what I call taking Easter seriously! I don't recommend the ice cream diet from now until Pentecost. I recommend doing whatever you need to do to be more conscious of and grateful for Jesus' resurrection of the dead throughout this season. Jesus tells us in John 15:11, "I have told you this so that my joy may be in you and that your joy may be complete." Isn't it beautiful that Jesus wants us to be completely joyful?

I hope and pray that you have an incredibly joyful Easter and carry the joy of the resurrected Christ in your heart now and always. Christ is Risen! Alleluia, Alleluia!!!

Friday was Opening Day for our Detroit Tigers. That's always been one of my favorite days of the year. It means that spring is truly here. I'm sorry that Opening Day conflicted this year with Good Friday. Baseball was the first sport that I played in grade school. I quickly came to appreciate the deeper nature of baseball. El Diario del Padre John

Mis hermanos y hermanas en Cristo,

¡Felices Pascuas! ¡Cristo ha resucitado!
¡Verdaderamente ha resucitado! ¡Aleluya! ¡Aleluya!
Hemos transitado nuestros cuarenta días de oración, ayuno y limosna durante la Cuaresma, y hemos caminado junto a Jesús a través de los acontecimientos transformadores de la Semana Santa. Estas celebraciones nos recuerdan cuánto nos ama Jesús. Es tiempo de celebrar con inmensa alegría la victoria de Jesús sobre el pecado y la muerte mediante su resurrección. Jesús, quien había hecho tanto bien y traído una esperanza tan grande a las personas, parecía haberse convertido en una luz trágicamente extinguida. La oscuridad había descendido verdaderamente sobre los discípulos de Jesús y sobre el mundo. A pesar de todo lo que Jesús había hecho para prepararlos, ciertamente no estaban listos para su espantosa muerte. La conmoción y la incredulidad, la tristeza y el dolor, dieron paso a la alegría de saber que Jesús había resucitado de entre los muertos. Imaginemos cómo sería para nosotros si uno de nuestros seres queridos más amados hubiera fallecido y, tres días después, nos enteráramos de que ha vuelto a la vida. Resulta difícil imaginar la profundidad de la alegría que sentiríamos ante la resurrección de nuestro ser querido. Los adversarios de Jesús habían intentado deshacerse de él. Creían haber cumplido su misión, pero las cosas no resultaron tan bien para ellos. Claramente, no sabían con quién se estaban enfrentando: el Hijo de Dios y el Salvador del Mundo.

La alegría es la esencia misma de la Pascua. Tenemos nuestras cruces, nuestras pruebas, nuestras frustraciones y nuestras dificultades en la vida. Necesitamos la alegría de saber que Dios tiene algo maravilloso reservado para nosotros, algo que supera incluso las cosas más grandiosas que jamás podríamos imaginar en nuestra vida en este mundo. El mal, el pecado, el diablo y la muerte han sido vencidos por Jesús de una vez por todas mediante su resurrección de entre los muertos. Se nos ha abierto el camino para estar con Dios para siempre en el cielo. La muerte vendrá a llevarnos, pero no podrá retenernos gracias a la cruz y a la resurrección de Jesús. Tenemos motivos para una inmensa alegría. ¡¡¡Aleluya!!! Tenemos la oportunidad de celebrar esta alegría pascual durante una “octava” —ocho días— y, posteriormente, a lo largo del resto del tiempo pascual, que se extiende por cincuenta días hasta que celebremos la venida del Espíritu Santo en Pentecostés.

Una parte especial de la Pascua cada año es la iniciación de nuestros hermanos y hermanas en nuestra fe católica a través de los sacramentos del Bautismo, la Confirmación y la Comunión durante nuestra Misa de la Vigilia Pascual. Estos hombres, mujeres, adolescentes y niños se han preparado exhaustivamente para consagrarse a Dios por medio de nuestra fe católica. Les

damos la bienvenida a nuestras parroquias dentro de la Familia de Parroquias Quo Vadis. Felicito a cada uno de ellos y a sus familias, y les agradezco su testimonio de nuestra fe. Son para nosotros un poderoso recordatorio tanto de la belleza, la bondad y el desafío de nuestra fe católica, como de todo aquello a lo que cada uno de nosotros está llamado a ser y a hacer. ¡Que Dios bendiga a cada uno de ellos mientras continúan avanzando en su camino de fe!

¿Qué podemos hacer para celebrar los cincuenta días del tiempo pascual y mantener vivo nuestro sentido de la alegría de la Pascua durante toda la temporada? Esa es una buena pregunta. ¡Requiere esfuerzo! Cuando prestaba servicio en el seminario, uno de los seminaristas se comprometió a comer helado cada uno de los cincuenta días. ¡A eso le llamo yo tomarse la Pascua en serio! No recomiendo la dieta del helado desde ahora hasta Pentecostés. Recomiendo hacer todo lo que sea necesario para ser más conscientes de la resurrección de Jesús de entre los muertos —y estar más agradecidos por ella— a lo largo de este tiempo. Jesús nos dice en Juan 15:11: “Les he dicho esto para que mi alegría esté en ustedes y para que su alegría sea completa”. ¿Acaso no es hermoso que Jesús quiera que estemos plenamente alegres?

Espero y rezo para que tengas una Pascua increíblemente gozosa y llesves la alegría de Cristo resucitado en tu corazón, ahora y siempre. ¡Cristo ha resucitado! ¡Aleluya, aleluya!

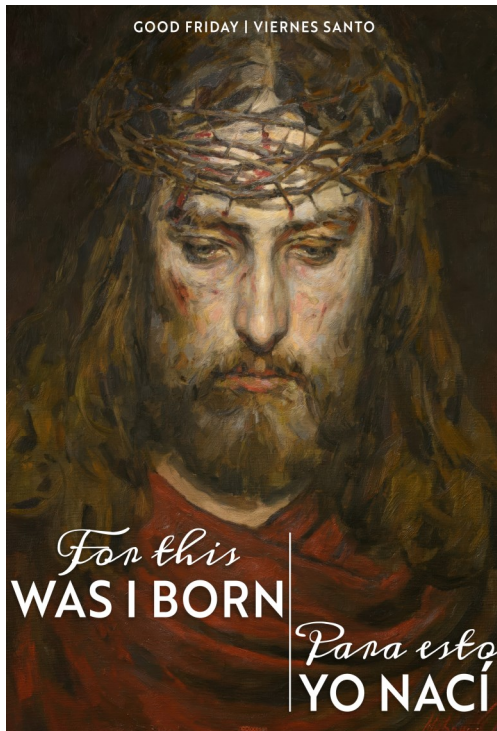

Did You Know?

With the parish membership continually growing, more parking spaces were needed, so a lot on Hanna Street was purchased in 1956 to enlarge the parking lot. A small lot across from the church on Outer Drive was also purchased to help ease the parking situation.

The first floor of the school addition was ready for use in September of 1957. More classrooms were still needed. During the 1957-58 school year arrangements were made to use a classroom at St. Sebastian School. The fourth-grade class was taken by bus every morning and returned in the afternoon after school. An addition to the school was opened in 1957.

The year 1960 saw many improvements to the parish property: A field house was built on the athletic field, an addition was made to the convent, the parking lot was blacktopped, and the lot and house adjoining the convent was purchased for any additional sisters who may be assigned.

The boys' choir, under the direction of Mr. James Hansen, made history in our parish in 1963. After giving a concert for the parish, they made a record which had remarkable sales. Word of our talented young men spread and they were invited to perform in Marquette, Michigan.

They gave a concert there and the following day sang at the ordination Mass. The boys were invited to eat dinner with Bishop Noa and other priests after the ordination; and upon entering the dining area, they were greeted with an enthusiastic ovation.

On their trip home, they stopped at Marywood, our religious sisters' home in Grand Rapids, and were treated to dinner. The boys, in turn treated the sisters to an impromptu concert.

In 1964 repairs were made to the convent and another addition to the school began. Plans for additions to the convent and rectory were drawn up in 1965 with work to be completed in 1966.

Easter Sunday

Believing in Seeing

You've heard the saying "Seeing is believing." Today's first reading seems to say just the opposite. You might think that when Jesus rose from the dead, everyone would see him. Yet Peter says that he was only visible to some of the disciples.

Even they did not immediately see him. The first thing they saw was the empty tomb, with burial cloths lying on the ground. They may have thought that if his enemies had stolen Jesus' body, they would not have removed the burial cloths; touching a corpse would have made them unclean.

So it seems the empty tomb helped them to believe, and believing enabled them to see the Lord. The exception to this may be Thomas, who said he would not believe until he saw and touched Jesus' risen body. Yet when he does see the Lord, Jesus himself declares that believing is primary when he blesses those who have not seen but still believe (John 20:31).

What does this mean for us? Jesus seems to be hidden again. Yet we say that he is present in the sacraments; Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation show that the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit live in us. So perhaps we just need to believe in order to see him.

Mother Teresa could do it. She said she was amazed at the love she felt when she saw Jesus in the poor and the dying people of Calcutta. Maybe we need to grow in faith so that we can see Jesus in the poor, the dying, the people who annoy us, even our enemies.

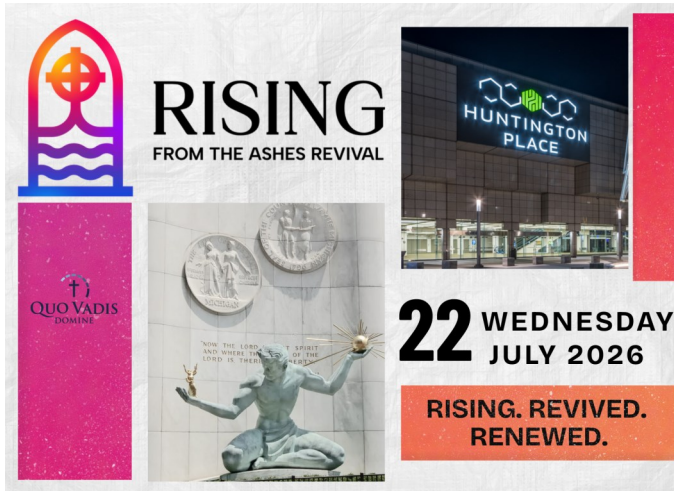

A large-scale revival of faith centered in the Eucharist will take place July 22, 2026, along the banks of the Detroit River, where Detroit’s faith story began nearly 325 years ago.

The Rising from the Ashes Revival will be a daylong event hosted at Huntington Place in downtown Detroit that will offer thousands of people an opportunity to grow, renew, and deepen their faith in Christ through the Holy Eucharist.

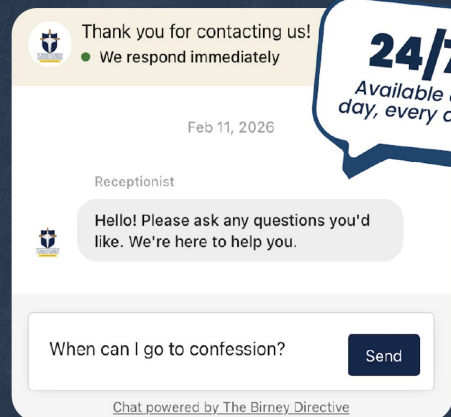
