Fr. John's Journal



My Brothers and Sisters in Christ,
On Friday evening at Sacred Heart Major Seminary in Detroit, there was an event entitled, "Viva Cristo Rey: On the Centennial of the Cristero War, 1926-2026." This event was meant to highlight the 100th anniversary of the start of Mexico's Cristero Counterrevolution—a three-year resistance from 1926-1929 by

ordinary Catholics in Mexico against their government's violent persecution against the Catholic Church during those years. The history of the Cristero War is not well known here in the U.S., although some of us may have seen the 2012 movie about this war, "For Greater Glory: The True Story of Cristiada" starring Andy Garcia, Eva Longoria and Peter O'Toole.

It's very difficult to imagine that such a persecution could ever occur in such a Catholic country like Mexico where the faith blossomed so rapidly after the apparition of the Blessed Mother in 1512 under the image and title of Our Lady of Guadalupe. This persecution had its roots in the 1917 Mexican Constitution that contained provisions to subject the Catholic Church to control by the Mexican government. This constitution put limits on public worship, the operation of Catholic schools, ownership of property by the Church, the practices of religious orders and the ministry of priests. These limits were intensified by laws enacted by the Mexican President Plutarco Elias Calles in 1926. With the suspension of public worship that year, the "Cristiada" resistance began. For some this resistance was passive and peaceful. For others it meant taking up arms against the Mexican government. In the end as many as 100,000 Catholics died during this war. Many of the martyrs died shouting, "Viva Cristo Rey" or "long live Christ the King." The U.S. ambassador to Mexico, Dwight Morrow, with the support of the Vatican and the Knights of Columbus, negotiated an agreement with the Mexican government in 1929 that allowed public worship to be restored and armed resistance against the government to end.

Why is the Cristero War important for us to know about now in the United States?

- This was a time of great strife and suffering for the people and the Catholic Church of Mexico. Although there were so many losses during this period of time, the states of Jalisco, Guanajuato, Michoacán, and Zacatecas, where so many of the Cristero martyrs died, are some of the areas in Mexico now where the Catholic faith is the strongest. As Tertullian wrote in the second century, "The blood of martyrs is the seed of the Church." God worked even through this great tragedy to bring about much good that still endures.
- There were many inspiring saints and martyrs who offered such great witness to Jesus and the Gospel

in this time of persecution such as St. Cristóbal Magallanes, St. José Luis Sánchez del Río, Blessed Miguel Pro and many others.

- The Knights of Columbus in Mexico were very strong and courageous in standing up for the Catholic faith and resisting the persecution that the Church was undergoing there. The Knights of Columbus in the United States were likewise very strong in advocating for the U.S. government to apply pressure to Mexico to end this persecution. The Knights of Columbus did so much good for the Church during those very dark times in Mexico.
- Because priests during that period in Mexico were under such great scrutiny, limitations and danger, it was lay men and women who needed to lead the defense of the Church. The laity also kept the Church going by leading prayer services in secret and continuing to catechize children in the faith. That period is a good reminder of the importance of lay people being well formed in our Catholic faith and always being actively engaged in teaching and witnessing to our faith.
- The persecution of the Church in Mexico began gradually through changes in laws and practices and eventually the constitution. This is a reminder for all of us of the importance of being aware of what's happening with our government and being engaged in the political process so that a persecution like this never happens in our country. We can't be naïve in thinking this could never happen here.
- The cry "Viva Cristo Rey" is a reminder to us here in the U.S. as well of the allegiance that we owe first and foremost to Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. Our political leaders and political parties have their positives and their negatives. They are sinners like the rest of us. They are capable of good and capable evil, especially at extremes. We are God's beloved sons and daughters and Catholics first and foremost. Not Democrats. Not Republicans. Not Independents.

It is estimated that 35 - 40% of U.S. Catholics are Hispanic. Many of them are from Mexico. The Cristero War is a part of the tapestry of their faith experience and heritage, so it is important to all of us as well in the U.S. Catholic Church. Inspired by the faith and the witness of ordinary Catholics, saints and martyrs during the Cristero War, may we be every more grateful for and committed to our Catholic faith.

El Diario del Padre John

Mis hermanos y hermanas en Cristo,

El viernes por la tarde, en el Seminario Mayor del Sagrado Corazón de Detroit, se celebró un evento titulado “Viva Cristo Rey: En el centenario de la Guerra Cristera, 1926-2026”. El acto tenía como objetivo conmemorar el centenario del inicio de la contrarrevolución cristera en México: una resistencia de tres años (1926-1929) protagonizada por católicos de a pie frente a la violenta persecución que el gobierno mexicano ejerció contra la Iglesia Católica durante aquel periodo. La historia de la Guerra Cristera no es muy conocida en Estados Unidos, aunque es posible que algunos hayamos visto la película de 2012 sobre este conflicto, “For Greater Glory: The True Story of Cristiada” (titulada en español Cristiada), protagonizada por Andy García, Eva Longoria y Peter O’Toole.

Resulta muy difícil imaginar que pudiera producirse tal persecución en un país tan católico como México, donde la fe floreció con tanta rapidez tras la aparición de la Santísima Madre en 1512 bajo la imagen y advocación de Nuestra Señora de Guadalupe. Esta persecución tuvo su origen en la Constitución mexicana de 1917, la cual incluía disposiciones para someter a la Iglesia Católica al control del gobierno mexicano. Dicha Constitución imponía restricciones al culto público, al funcionamiento de las escuelas católicas, a la propiedad de bienes por parte de la Iglesia, a las actividades de los órdenes religiosos y al ministerio sacerdotal. Estas limitaciones se vieron agravadas por leyes promulgadas en 1926 por el presidente mexicano Plutarco Elías Calles. Con la suspensión del culto público ese mismo año, comenzó la resistencia conocida como la “Cristiada.” Para algunos, esta resistencia fue pasiva y pacífica; para otros, implicó tomar las armas contra el gobierno mexicano. En última instancia, hasta 100.000 católicos perdieron la vida durante este conflicto. Muchos de los mártires murieron exclamando: “¡Viva Cristo Rey!”. El embajador de Estados Unidos en México, Dwight Morrow, con el respaldo del Vaticano y de los Caballeros de Colón, negoció un acuerdo con el gobierno mexicano en 1929 que permitió restablecer el culto público y poner fin a la resistencia armada contra el gobierno.

¿Por qué es importante para nosotros en Estados Unidos conocer la Guerra Cristera hoy en día?

- Fue una época de gran conflicto y sufrimiento para el pueblo y la Iglesia católica de México. Aunque hubo numerosas pérdidas durante este periodo, los estados de Jalisco, Guanajuato, Michoacán y Zacatecas —donde perecieron tantos mártires cristeros— se cuentan hoy entre las zonas de México donde la fe católica es más fuerte. Como escribió Tertuliano en el siglo II: “La sangre de los mártires es semilla de la Iglesia.” Dios obró incluso a través de esta gran tragedia para suscitar un gran bien que aún perdura.
- Hubo muchos santos y mártires inspiradores que dieron un testimonio tan grande de Jesús y del Evangelio en esta época de persecución, tales como

san Cristóbal Magallanes, san José Luis Sánchez del Río, el beato Miguel Pro y muchos otros.

- Los Caballeros de Colón en México se mostraron muy firmes y valientes al defender la fe católica y resistir la persecución que sufría la Iglesia en el país. Del mismo modo, los Caballeros de Colón en Estados Unidos actuaron con gran firmeza al instar al gobierno estadounidense a presionar a México para poner fin a dicha persecución. Los Caballeros de Colón hicieron un gran bien a la Iglesia durante aquellos tiempos tan sombríos en México.
- Dado que, durante aquel periodo en México, los sacerdotes estaban sometidos a un intenso escrutinio, a restricciones y a peligros, fueron los hombres y mujeres laicos quienes tuvieron que liderar la defensa de la Iglesia. Los laicos también mantuvieron viva a la Iglesia dirigiendo servicios de oración en secreto y continuando con la catequesis de los niños en la fe. Aquella época nos recuerda la importancia de que los laicos estén bien formados en nuestra fe católica y participen siempre activamente en la enseñanza y el testimonio de nuestra fe.
- La persecución de la Iglesia en México comenzó gradualmente mediante cambios en las leyes y las prácticas, y finalmente en la Constitución. Esto nos recuerda a todos la importancia de estar atentos a lo que sucede con nuestro gobierno y de participar en el proceso político, para que una persecución así nunca ocurra en nuestro país. No podemos ser ingenuos y pensar que esto jamás podría suceder aquí.
- El grito de “¡Viva Cristo Rey!” nos recuerda también a nosotros, aquí en los Estados Unidos, la lealtad que debemos ante todo a Jesucristo, Rey del Universo. Nuestros líderes y partidos políticos tienen aspectos positivos y negativos. Son pecadores, como todos nosotros. Son capaces tanto del bien como del mal, especialmente en los extremos. Somos hijos e hijas amados de Dios y, ante todo, católicos. Ni demócratas, ni republicanos, ni independientes.

Se estima que entre el 35 % y el 40 % de los católicos estadounidenses son hispanos. Muchos de ellos provienen de México. La Guerra Cristera forma parte del entramado de su experiencia de fe y de su legado, por lo que también es importante para todos nosotros en la Iglesia católica de los Estados Unidos. Que, inspirados por la fe y el testimonio de los católicos comunes, los santos y los mártires de la Guerra Cristera, nos sintamos cada vez más agradecidos por nuestra fe católica y más comprometidos con ella.

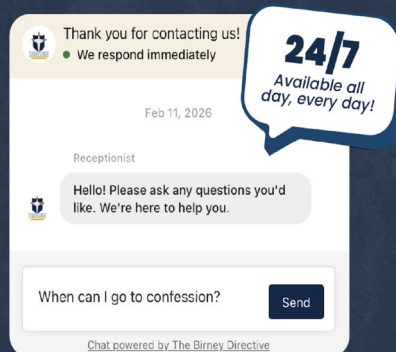

Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

A Mighty God

The first reading says that God's might is the basis for divine justice. We might take this to mean that God uses mighty power to punish sinners, in the legal sense of justice. But the reading also talks about God's lenience and clemency.

So maybe God's power is so great that punishment is not necessary. Sinners can be forgiven. After all, we usually punish those we fear will hurt us again. But God is too powerful to be injured by our sins. God can afford to wait for us to repent. That is the point of the parable of the wheat and the weeds. We are used to expecting swift justice. We like TV shows in which the bad guy is caught and convicted in an hour.

The idea of God giving sinners until the end of time to repent is almost un-American—at least, until we realize that we are sinners, too. "But my sins are so minor." Even the smallest sin says that we know better than God what is right. Yet God is still willing to wait for all of us to repent.

On the other hand, we hear people who say they don't deserve to be forgiven. True, but no one could ever deserve forgiveness. That is the wonder of God's love, that God's Son came to die for sinners, even before we sinned. As we experience that forgiveness, we learn the depth of God's love for us. Hopefully, we also learn to share that love with others.

Of course, that means that we also share forgiveness with others. If God waits till "the end of the age" before burning the weeds, shouldn't we be willing to forgive those who hurt us?

The Church encourages us to celebrate the sacrament of reconciliation often. Many people today wait till they have a lot of sins, or at least one whopper, to confess.

But the more often we go, the more we are reminded of God's love and forgiveness. Those reminders can help us to be more willing to show mercy ourselves.

Let us ask God for the courage to seek forgiveness and the strength to forgive.

Apostle to the Apostles

St. Mary Magdalene is a powerful patron of penitents, contemplation, and converts. Whether seeking her intercession for forgiveness, spiritual healing, or the courage to share your faith, her prayer reflects her role as the "Apostle to the Apostles".

St. Mary Magdalen was never formally canonized. She was recognized as a saint before the formal papal canonization process was established. Her sainthood was confirmed through widespread devotion in the early centuries of the Church. Pope Francis elevated her liturgical rank from a MEMORIAL to a FEAST. This gives her liturgical ranking equal to the male apostles and highlights her title as the "Apostle to the Apostles".

She is considered the first to witness the Risen Christ and proclaim the Resurrection. St. Mary Magdalen feast day is July 22.

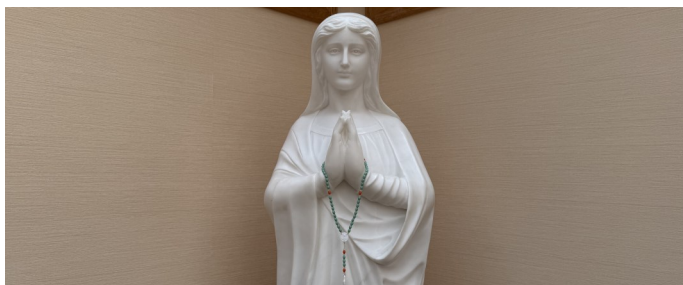

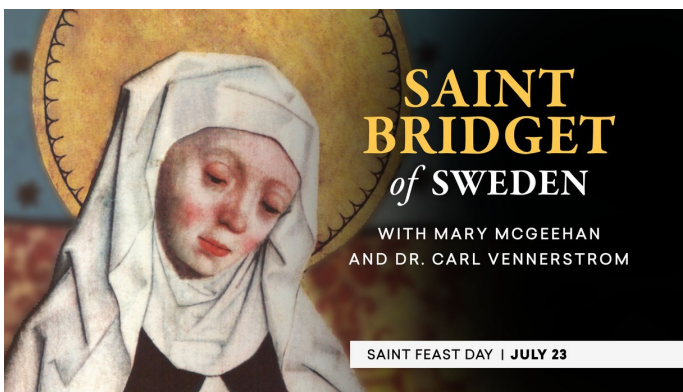

Summer UV Protection: Key Facts you should know

Ultraviolet (UV) radiation from the sun can damage your skin and eyes, increasing the risk of sunburn, premature skin aging, cataracts, and skin cancer. UV protection is important all year—not just on hot, sunny days. UV rays can penetrate clouds and reflect off water, sand, concrete, and snow.

Top UV Protection Tips

1. Use sunscreen every day
 - Choose a broad-spectrum sunscreen (protects against both UVA and UVB rays).
 - Use SPF 30 or higher for best everyday protection.
 - Apply sunscreen 15 minutes before going outside and reapply every 2 hours, or more often if swimming or sweating.
2. Seek shade during peak sun hours
 - UV rays are strongest between 10am and 4pm in most areas.
 - Check the daily UV Index. When it's 3 or higher, take protective measures.
3. Wear protective clothing
 - Long-sleeved shirts, long pants, and tightly woven fabrics provide additional UV protection.
 - Consider clothing labeled with a UPF (Ultraviolet Protection Factor) rating.
4. Don't forget your hat and sunglasses
 - Wear a wide-brimmed hat to protect your face, ears, and neck.
 - Choose sunglasses that block 100% of UVA and UVB rays.
5. Avoid tanning beds
 - Artificial tanning devices expose users to UV radiation that can increase skin cancer risk. A tan is actually a sign of skin damage.

Common Myths

"I'm safe if it's cloudy."

Up to much of the sun's UV radiation can still reach your skin on cloudy days.

"People with darker skin don't need sunscreen."

Everyone can experience UV damage and develop skin cancer, regardless of skin tone.

"A base tan protects me."

A tan indicates skin injury and does not provide meaningful protection against future UV damage.

Quick Summer Reminder

Slip on protective clothing, Slop on sunscreen, Slap on a hat, Seek shade, and Slide on sunglasses. Combined protection works much better than sunscreen alone.
